1. Approval of Agenda – September 19, 2023

May indicated we had just received a grant payment of \$100,800 from the DNR which will allow us to cover the current bills. - c. RRWC Strategic Planning Grant Contract Update
 - i. May will sign the contract after the discussion with the consultant on September 11 about their proposal
- d. Log Jam Removal Requests Technical Committee
 - i. Committee met to discussed Dundee log jam. Access and permits will be needed. They will put together a log jam removal policy and documents to detail the process, as we get many requests for assistance.

- d. Artalicious Lopez reported they had set up a booth at the event in Adrian last weekend. They had kids activities and estimate 400 kids went through.

- a. Forests to Michigan Faucets Update
 - i. Meeting next week to discuss the agreement prior to finalizing this program. It would be a \$50,000 grant for three years to focus on planting trees in the watershed.
- b. River Raisin Nature Exploration Programs Project Contract Signed Update
 - i. Lopez reported the grant will begin in October with our first event on October 7. There will be three programs each month for a year on a specific theme that will be presented to middle school kids, elementary school kids and parents and a third one for adults. Lopez will schedule these events throughout the watershed.
- c. Water sampling proposal:
 - Based on interest and requests by lake communities for water sampling, Lopez suggested we consider establishing a program for RRWC staff to help with that sampling for a fee.
