- f. Grants Update: Washtenaw County Water Resources Commission has given us the \$24,759.00 check after creating a contract for RRWC to provide certain resources (Adopt-A-Stream, Farmer-Led Group, educational materials) in Washtenaw County.

- a. River Raisin Water Festival: May 1, 2019: Continuing to find grants and work on budget.
- b. Discover the Raisin Updates: 2 applicants: 1 from Monroe and 1 from Clinton.
- c. Adopt-A-Stream Logo: After voting between winner of last week's vote and the original "Mac", the committee has decided to keep Mac as the Adopt-A-Stream mascot/logo.
- d. MJR Theater Marketing Spot: Changed ad play dates to April through June. 6 photos have been submitted for the photo contest (their photo will appear in the ad). Voting for the winner will be on Facebook (most likes = winner) from Jan. 29 through Feb. 5.
- e. Paco Ollervides River Network: Informed us about Cleveland National Watersheds Conference in June. Will introduce RRWC with Friends of the St. Clair River, an up-and-coming group to partner with. Provided information about the River Network and encouraged RRWC to join. He will attend a future meeting.
- f. AmeriCorps: Thinking ahead to have a crew of 8 in the fall. Open to locations, possibly working with the Friends of the Saline River or at the Leslee Niethammer Preserve in Saline as they need help with maintenance and creating a new trail connecting the preserve with adjacent DNR land.
- g. Manchester/Bridgewater Twp/Sharon Twp RR Signage: Jim Mann has a donor willing to pay for mile marker signs through the three areas: miles 99.5 through 118.5. It would be a scout project.
- h. Adopt-A-Stream Equipment: Dr. Martin requested new nets (number unknown). We found 2 options and he's reviewing which he'd prefer. Other equipment he may need will be discussed after meeting with him after the beginning of the semester.

RRWC Semi-Annual Meeting: April 25, 2019 at Cabela's – Need to create Nominating Committee as multiple Executive Committee members may not hold more terms in their current officer seats (the limit per bylaws is six years). Need to learn of interest of other delegates who want to be on the committee.

- b. Loch Erin Water Quality Update Sybil attended monthly meeting of the Loch Erin Property Owners Association to keep updated. Danielle Brosamer (Siena Heights student) is looking into options for water testing: limited tests available at Siena Heights, partner/supplement DEQ testing, Heidleburg University equipment and labs, or Adrian wastewater facility.
- c. Silent Auction at Spring Meeting 2019 email businesses for requests soon and have items by March.
- d. Staff Katie will be working over 1,000 hours and RRWC must cover 5% match for retirement per County requirements. We will begin covering this now, instead of retroactively.
- e. Clinton Arts Center Creating a Community Conversation at the Oak Openings Restaurant on Tuesdays. Jan. 29 at 6:30pm will be Sybil and others talking about water quality. 10 minute talk with discussion to follow. Consider Executive Committee meetings held there in the spring.
